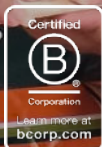
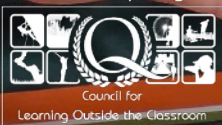

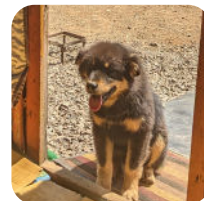

-  Step back in time at a traditional nomadic camp on the Mongolian Steppes to experience authentic traditions, including archery, horse racing, and wrestling.
-  Hike through the picturesque granite valleys, lakes, and mountain meadows of Terelj National Park, taking in breathtaking views of the Mongolian wilderness.
-  Visit world-class museums, marvel at the 40-metre Chinggis Khan Statue Complex, learn to cook traditional food, and experience the iconic sound of traditional throat singing and dance.

Arrival & induction

Welcome to Mongolia!

Your Mongolian adventure begins as you land at Chinggis Khaan International Airport, where our team will welcome you before driving you to your accommodation in Ulaanbaatar.

Once settled in, you'll receive a comprehensive orientation to review your schedule, brief you on cultural rules and safety protocols, and ease into local customs. Later, get familiar with your new surroundings during a guided city tour, followed by a relaxed evening.

Your second day focuses on preparing you for the week ahead. In the morning, visit the local school to meet the staff and observe ongoing lessons to get a feel for the classroom environment. In the afternoon, participate in a project induction where you'll learn how to plan and lead engaging educational activities, followed by time to explore the city before enjoying a welcome meal at a local restaurant to get your first taste of traditional Mongolian cuisine.

Education & history

The next four days will be split between hands-on classroom assistance, light physical renovation, and rich local cultural experiences.

In the mornings, lead interactive educational activities for the children. Whether it's teaching basic conversational English through games, encouraging creativity through arts and crafts, or organising physical activities, your sessions will focus on fun, active learning with clear objectives.

In the afternoons, roll up your sleeves to assist with renovation work at the school to enhance the learning environment for the children. You'll engage in lesson planning sessions on some afternoons to ensure you have plenty of time to prepare materials and activities for the days ahead.

Outside the school, immerse yourself in the rich local culture. Step back in time as you learn about the country's fascinating history at the National Museum of Mongolia, admire breathtaking panoramic views from the Zaisan Hill Memorial, master some traditional dishes with a hands-on cooking class, and let loose with karaoke night.





Days 7-8

In the Mongolian Steppe

After a week of hard work, step away from the capital for a weekend of scenery and tradition. On Day 7, take a two-hour drive out to a Mongol nomadic camp to experience authentic steppe living firsthand. You will learn about traditional nomadic life and watch live demonstrations of the iconic “Three Manly Games”: traditional wrestling, archery, and horse racing. Return to Ulaanbaatar in the evening for dinner and relaxation.

On the morning of Day 8, travel 54km outside the city to the breathtaking Chinggis Khan Statue Complex. Marvel at the giant 40-metre stainless steel statue sitting atop the world’s largest equestrian monument, learning about the founder of the Mongol Empire.

After lunch, head into scenic Terelj National Park for a peaceful afternoon hike. Walk past mountain lakes and meadows and through dramatic granite valleys as you take in the untouched natural beauty of the region before returning to the city.



Back to school & cultural immersion

Return to the school for your second week, continuing your morning educational sessions, structured afternoon lesson planning, and completing your renovation tasks. These final days are a wonderful opportunity to see the progress of your classroom physical improvements and build deeper connections with the children.

Outside of the classroom, you'll continue your cultural immersion as you experience the magical sounds of a unique vocal technique during a traditional concert featuring iconic throat singing and dance. You'll also explore the immersive Chinggis Khaan Museum, where cutting-edge augmented reality (AR) and virtual reality (VR) technologies bring Mongolia's ancient history to life.

To wrap up your cultural journey, you will have the chance to try on traditional Mongolian clothing during a fun group photoshoot. On your final evening, you will celebrate your journey and shared accomplishments with a memorable farewell dinner alongside local staff.





Departure

As you fly home, look back on the incredible work you've done over the last two weeks.

Think about your newfound confidence, skills, and cultural understanding gained during your journey; these are experiences that will stay with you for the rest of your life.

Mongolia, known as “The Land of the Eternal Blue Sky”, is a true one-off. Discover a country rich in history and culture, where one-third of people live as nomads, moving their traditional ger homes with the seasons. Witness an ancient way of life and enjoy stunning landscapes.

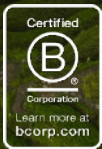
