► Diver Certification

Complete the CMAS One Star Diver certification, which is a comprehensive entry-level diving qualification that provides thorough theoretical and practical training for new divers. Participants learn essential skills including underwater communication, dive planning, equipment management, and critical safety procedures through both classroom instruction and practical pool and open water training.

► Conservation & Environmental Protection

Participate in active seabed cleanup initiatives, removing marine debris and plastic pollution to directly improve the health of Mediterranean marine ecosystems. Contribute to social media and educational awareness campaigns that highlight the critical importance of marine conservation, engaging local communities and international audiences in understanding the challenges facing marine environments.

► Community & Collaborative Impact

Work alongside a local Community Centre, passionate about improving the lives of underserved people in Barcelona. Assist with daily operations and create meaningful, tangible contributions to marine conservation education. Build a supportive learning community that shares knowledge, experiences, and a commitment to education and environmental protection.

Timings

This schedule is subject to change, however you will be advised in advance should this happen. You will depart home before 9am and arrive back at around 7pm. However, this may differ from day to day depending on the activity and progress of the volunteer work.

Day 1	Sunday
All Day	You'll arrive at the airport where program staff will meet you and transfer you to your accommodation in Barcelona. The journey offers your first glimpse of the beautiful Catalanian landscape as you make your way to what will be your home during this conservation adventure. After settling into your room and unpacking, you'll join a casual welcome gathering to meet fellow volunteers and program coordinators. This initial meet-and-greet includes light refreshments and gives you a chance to get acquainted with the people you'll be working alongside during your marine conservation journey.



Day 2	Monday
Morning	The program officially begins with a comprehensive orientation session covering program goals, safety protocols, and conservation objectives. You'll receive detailed information about the program and the NGO's mission to protect Barcelona's marine ecosystems.
Afternoon	Participate in an engaging team-building workshop designed to foster cooperation and communication among all volunteers. The afternoon continues with your first Spanish language class, focusing on basic vocabulary that will be useful throughout your stay.
Evening	Challenge yourself with an outdoor climbing workshop, designed to build trust among your fellow volunteers while enjoying a summer evening in Barcelona.
Day 3	Tuesday
Morning	Experience your first dive session where CMAS certification training begins, with instructors introducing fundamental diving techniques and safety procedures. You'll become familiar with diving equipment and practice basic underwater skills in a controlled environment as you begin your journey toward certification.
Afternoon	Engage in community work at the Community Centre, helping with the children’s summer camp and running activities focussed on the environment. You'll assist with organizing equipment, preparing educational materials, and contributing to daily operations.
Evening	Explore Barcelona's historic streets on a guided walking tour, discovering hidden gems and iconic landmarks with staff supervision.
Day 4	Wednesday
Morning	Participate in an underwater biodiversity observation and debris dive, where you'll identify various marine species while practicing your diving skills. Instructors will guide you through techniques for observing marine life without disturbing natural habitats, an essential skill for conservation diving.
Afternoon	Receive detailed equipment training, learning how to properly maintain and handle specialized conservation tools used in underwater research and cleanup efforts. The session continues with a comprehensive education module about local Mediterranean ecosystems, their importance, and the threats they face. Travel to the Community Centre for training about their operations and protocols, followed by an interactive Spanish lesson.
Evening	Dinner and relax at the hostel.
Day 5	Thursday
Morning	Participate in your first marine cleanup dive, actively removing debris from the seabed while learning to identify harmful versus harmless materials. Afterward, you'll assist with equipment maintenance, learning the proper care techniques that ensure longevity and reliability of diving gear.
Afternoon	Contribute to the Community Centre’s social media conservation awareness campaign by helping create compelling content about your marine cleanup experience. You'll learn how effective communication and digital storytelling play crucial roles in building public support for marine conservation initiatives.
Evening	Prepare for the diving certification, enjoy dinner & unwind.



Day 6	Friday
Morning	Complete your certification dive and examination, demonstrating the skills you've developed throughout the week under instructor supervision. Your performance will be evaluated based on diving technique, safety awareness, and environmental sensitivity during underwater operations.
Afternoon	Head back to the Community Centre for lunch and to assist with the summer camp activities, followed by an emotional intelligence workshop. The workshop explores how personal emotions and attitudes impact our work and how to work best as a team.
Evening	Head back to the hostel for some games before dinner.
Day 7	Saturday
Morning	Put your newly earned certification to use during a conservation dive, where you'll practice advanced equipment techniques while contributing to real environmental protection work. The morning session reinforces your skills while transitioning from training to active conservation contribution.
Afternoon	Take a well-deserved trip to Barcelona's beautiful beaches, where you can observe coastal ecosystems from shore and understand the connection between land and sea.
Evening	Enjoy free time at the hostel.
Day 8	Sunday
Morning	Tour the city by foot, walking past the breathtaking Sagrada Familia and Hospital de Sant Pau, as well as experience Antoni Gaudí's architectural masterpieces that define Barcelona's unique skyline. The guided tour provides historical and cultural context while allowing ample time for photography.
Afternoon	Explore Casa Batllo, La Pedrera, Plaza Catalunya, and Las Ramblas, witnessing the diverse architectural styles that make Barcelona a global design destination. Continue through Plaza Real and the Gothic Quarter (Barrio Gótico), where medieval structures create an atmospheric contrast to the modernist buildings seen earlier.
Evening	Visit the Palau de la Música and Barcelona Cathedral before concluding your sightseeing tour at Barceloneta Beach for a stunning Mediterranean sunset. After a long day of walking and exploring, take time to relax back at the hostel.



Day 9	Monday
Morning	Participate in a focused seabed cleanup dive, removing plastic waste and other harmful debris while documenting collection data for research purposes. Your growing confidence underwater allows for more effective conservation work as you systematically address pollution hotspots.
Afternoon	Engage in team-building activities designed to strengthen cooperation skills essential for underwater conservation teamwork. The afternoon continues with a Spanish workshop.
Evening	Enjoy free time to reflect on your experiences, catch up on personal interests, or socialize with fellow volunteers at the hostel.
Day 10	Tuesday
Morning	Join a marine life rescue operations dive, learning techniques for assisting distressed marine creatures and addressing entanglement situations. The training covers ethical interaction protocols and species-specific approaches to wildlife assistance in underwater environments.You'll input your observations into the organization's database and learn how this information informs policy recommendations and conservation strategies.
Afternoon	Head to the Community Centre to continue marine education activities for the children attending the summer camp.
Evening	Enjoy free time at the hostel before dinner.
Day 11	Wednesday
Morning	Engage in a comprehensive biodiversity observation and debris dive, systematically documenting marine species presence. Your improved diving skills allow for longer underwater observation periods, resulting in more valuable data collection for the NGO's ecosystem monitoring program.
Afternoon	Head to the Community Centre and apply your growing knowledge by contributing to article writing about your marine conservation experience. This hands-on communication experience helps develop your ability to translate scientific observations into accessible information for public awareness campaigns.
Evening	Enjoy free time at the hostel before dinner.

Day 12	Thursday
Morning	Participate in a conservation dive, cleaning rubbish and debris gathered in the port. Contribute to scientific research by assisting with detailed fauna documentation, including photography, measurement, and behavioral observation of species.
Afternoon	Head to the Community Centre to continue educational activities for the children attending the summer camp.
Evening	Return to the hostel for dinner and time to unwind.
Day 13	Friday
Morning	Complete your final conservation dive, demonstrating advanced diving techniques and environmental assessment skills.
Afternoon	Celebrate your achievements during a graduation ceremony where you'll receive your CMAS certification and participation certificate. The ceremony transitions into a celebratory lunch at the Community Centre.
Evening	Join fellow volunteers and staff for a special farewell dinner at a local restaurant featuring traditional Catalan dishes and music. The evening provides a meaningful conclusion to your conservation journey, with opportunities to exchange contact information and discuss how to continue supporting marine protection after returning home.
Day 14	Saturday & Sunday
Morning	Complete check-out procedures and say goodbye to the hostel that has been your home during this transformative experience. Transfer to the airport with plenty of time for check-in, accompanied by program staff who ensure a smooth departure process. The journey back to the airport offers a final glimpse of Barcelona and time to reflect on the skills, knowledge, and memories you've gained during your marine conservation program.
